## **Motor City Coney Island Grill**



Next to the future gluten-free bakery in Creekside Corners, Motor City Coney Island Grill softly launched Dec. 5 with a limited menu.

Owner Skender Kajoshaj, who bought a one-way ticket to Naples eight years ago from the Detroit area, shares the tastes and sounds of his Motown hometown.

The local restaurant imports beanless chili and natural casing hot dogs from Detroit to make its coney dogs, chili cheese dogs and "loose burgers," featuring a hot dog bun filled with loose ground beef, chili, onion and mustard. The new eatery also has half-pound burgers, gyros, chicken pita sandwiches, chicken tenders, fries and onion rings.

Hot dog prices range from \$3.99 for an all-American dog with ketchup and mustard to \$5.99 for a Detroit Dog with loose ground beef, beanless chili, diced onions and mustard. The piled-high burgers are \$11.24.

The casual, 1,400-square-foot eatery has a counter, booths and tables inside, and some covered tables outside.
